

# **Curriculum Overview**

## Term 2, 2022 Stage One (Years One and Two)



Dear Parents and Caregivers,

Welcome back to Stage One, Term 2 2022. We look forward to a fantastic term of fun and dynamic learning.



**<u>Religion</u>**: Our topic this term is **Christian Life**. Students will demonstrate an understanding and appreciation of Christian life as loving God and neighbour. Students will have an opportunity to wonder about Jesus and his disciples and learn from examples in the Gospels of how they too can show love towards their neighbour.

#### English:

Students will continue to build their literacy skills this term. Students will partake in **Shared Reading** where reading strategies are explored and modelled. **Guided reading** is where small group sessions focus on instructional strategies such as questioning, prompting and explaining to develop skills good readers use. **Independent reading** where students can continue to practice their reading skills and strategies independently. Our writing focus this term will build on the writing givens, which are: for all students to write full sentences, using correct grammar and punctuation, students each have their own **writing goal** which they are working towards both independently and in a small group intervention setting. We will continue to grow our speaking and listening skills through our **Play-Based Learning** (Play Pods). This term Kindergarten will be joining Stage 1 in the play-based learning experience.

<u>Mathematics</u>: Students will be learning about data, position, multiplication & division, fractions & decimals, length and areas & perimeter. There will be a strong emphasis on hands-on activities that involve rich problem-solving tasks. Students will engage in higher-order thinking as they work on appropriately-challenging tasks. The purpose of this is to promote problem-solving, reasoning and mathematical communication, where students can explain and build on learning.

**History:** This term our topic is **The Past in the Present: Changing Technology**. Students identify change and continuity in family and daily life using appropriate historical terms. They relate stories about their families' and communities' past and explore a point of view within a historical context. They identify and describe significant people, events, places and sites in the local community over time. Students describe the effects of changing technology on people's lives over time.Students sequence events in order, using a range of terms related to time. They pose questions about the past and use sources provided (such as physical, visual, oral) to answer these questions. They compare objects from the past and present. Students develop a narrative about the past using a range of texts.

<u>Science and Technology</u>: Our topic this term is **Digital Technologies**. Students investigate how digital systems display data and use a sequence of steps and decisions (algorithms) to solve problems. This topic develops students' understanding of how digital systems use algorithms to communicate.

**PDHPE (Sport): Sport will be held on Friday**. This term the children will be working on developing their ball skills. We will be working on skills such as rolling, stopping, dribbling, trapping and kicking the ball. 4 weeks of this will be a <u>Futsal Skills Program</u>. We will be building students cooperative, fair play and positive and inclusive interaction skills.

<u>PDHPE</u> (Health): This term's unit is Healthy Safe and Active Lifestyles. In this unit, students develop a stronger understanding of how to make positive decisions and the impact these have on themselves and others; including decisions about their hygiene, rest and play. Students practise how to seek help and participate in a variety of activities that promote healthy and safe lifestyles.

<u>Creative Arts</u>: This term students will be participating in **Drama** as part of the Creative Arts Syllabus. Students will explore and convey stories, events and feelings through roles and they work collaboratively to communicate and express feelings about the action of the drama. They will experience and respond to a range of drama forms and elements by making, performing, and appreciating drama.

<u>Visual Arts:</u> This term our Visual Arts Program will be run by Ms Morley on a <u>Thursday</u>. This term's theme is Wild about printing.Students will be Investigating different printing techniques using wild animals as the subject matter.

<u>Music</u>: The students will be participating in **Music** on a <u>Thursday</u> with Ms. Frazer. The students will continue learning the notes of the C major scale, and practising the skills of reading these notes and rhythms by playing simple tunes on the xylophones and electric pianos.

**Library:** Our Library Borrowing day is <u>Monday</u>. Library time is designed to encourage a lifelong love of literature. Please encourage your child to bring a library bag to school on Mondays and to borrow every week. This is vital to helping them to develop a love of reading and to their overall learning.

#### <u>Homework</u>

At the Stage One level, daily homework will take 15-30 minutes.

It is important for your child to develop good reading practices. We use the online **PM Readers** as home readers. A daily reading routine at this age level is crucial for positive reading results. It is also nice for students to read their library books to you or to read along as you read them. If you require physical home readers to be sent home, please contact me.
